# WELCOME TO THE MAKATON SIGN OF THE WEEK

It supports the development of essential communication skills such as attention and listening, comprehension, memory, recall and organisation of language and expression. In school, we use a lot of Makaton when we sing and when we talk to one another. In order to keep promoting and using Makaton, we will include a Makaton Sign of the Week for the children (and adults!) to learn and use. The lovely Mrs Deaves will model it for you.



This week's sign is: calm

Put both hands horizontally in front of you, with your palms facing down and then rotate hands around each other slowly. Don't forget to say 'calm'.




Each UK household spends around **£50 – £86 a year** to power appliances left in **standby mode** or **not in use**.






Yesterday the children took part in a range of activities including identifying the masked reader, making bookmarks, writing stories, an emoji reading quiz and much more. What an amazing day!
